GOSPEL PRESENTATION

Question: "If you were to die tonight, would you know for certain that you had the assurance of eternal life?"

PRAISE:

Psalm 9:1,2 "I will praise you, O Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonders. I will be glad and rejoice in you. I will sing praise to your name, O Most High."

Take 3 or 4 Psalms, write out the verses that particularly reflect your thoughts and feelings. Write in first person.

Psalm 50:23 "Whoever offers praise, glorifies me."

ADMIT:

Psalm 139:23,24 "Search me O God and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me and lead me in the way everlasting."
