Stone's Story

So good it just can't be a secret!

What is your favorite story you've told others and they like to share?

Think of, and share a historical marker whose story is told in the monument- along the lines of Raising the Flag on Iwo Jima.

Who is this stone? Why was it easy to reject it/him? What are the stones in our lives that are hard for us to accept, or embrace?
