One thing leads to another! Too much food leads to a nap. Late nights beg for late mornings. Loss of faith results in spiritual depression!

Paul tells the early church there is solid reason to be hopeful and secure.

1 Corinthians 15: 12-20 holds the foundation of faith and expectation for the church then and now!

This chapter begins with a commanding invitation: **vs. 1,2**

"Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain."

Think about the meaning of core words in these verses:

Remind Received Hold Fast Being Saved Believed

These active words play a part in all of our lives. Take these words and apply them the core message of **vs.12-20**

How do these words interact with the targeted message Paul has to share?

Jesus has left behind an empty tomb. How can you keep this reality present in your daily life?

How is Jesus' resurrection tied to your hope for today and eternity? Think about the relationship between our faith and our attitude, and then look at vs. 55!

Do we live today as victims or victors? How does it show?
